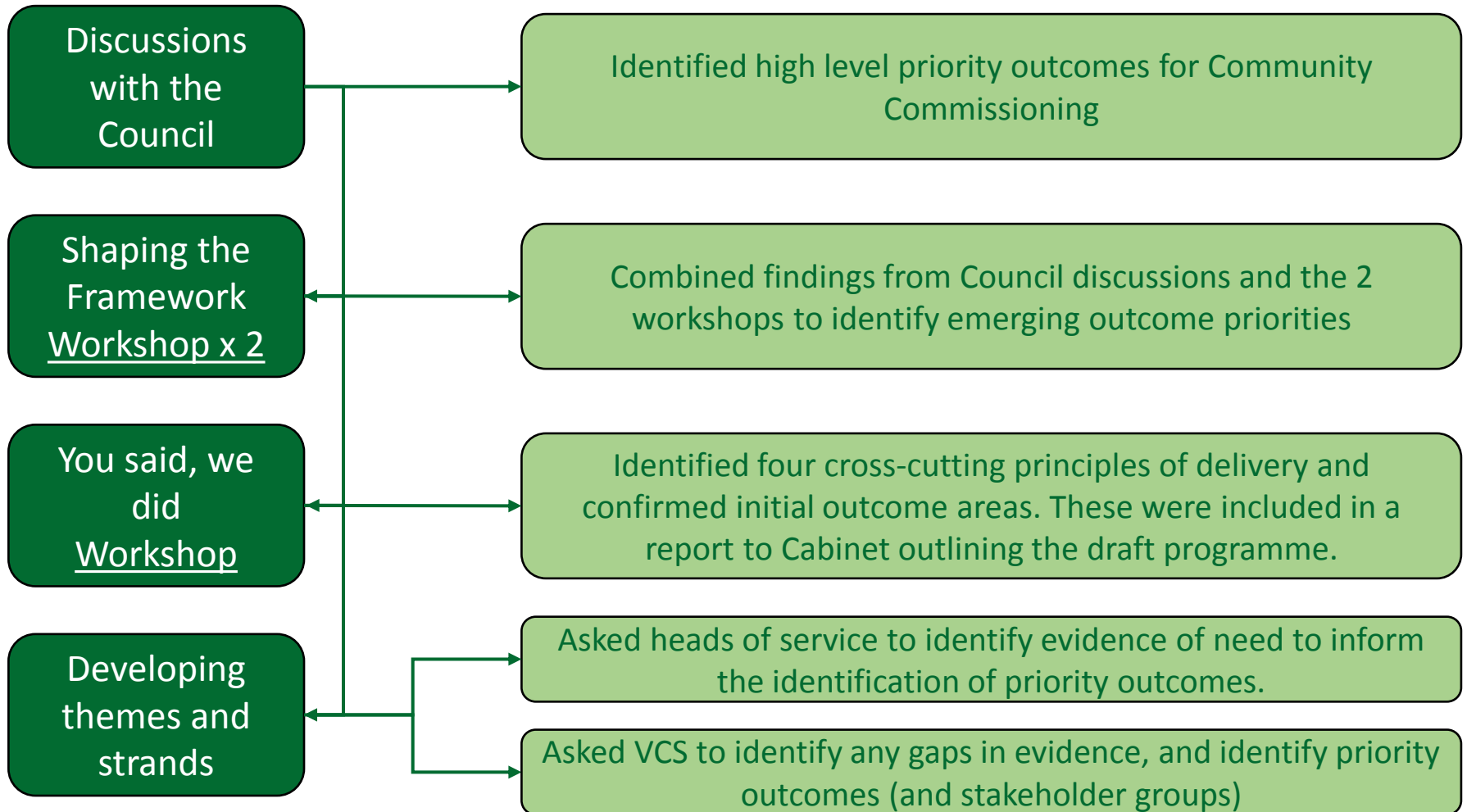

Initial outcome areas

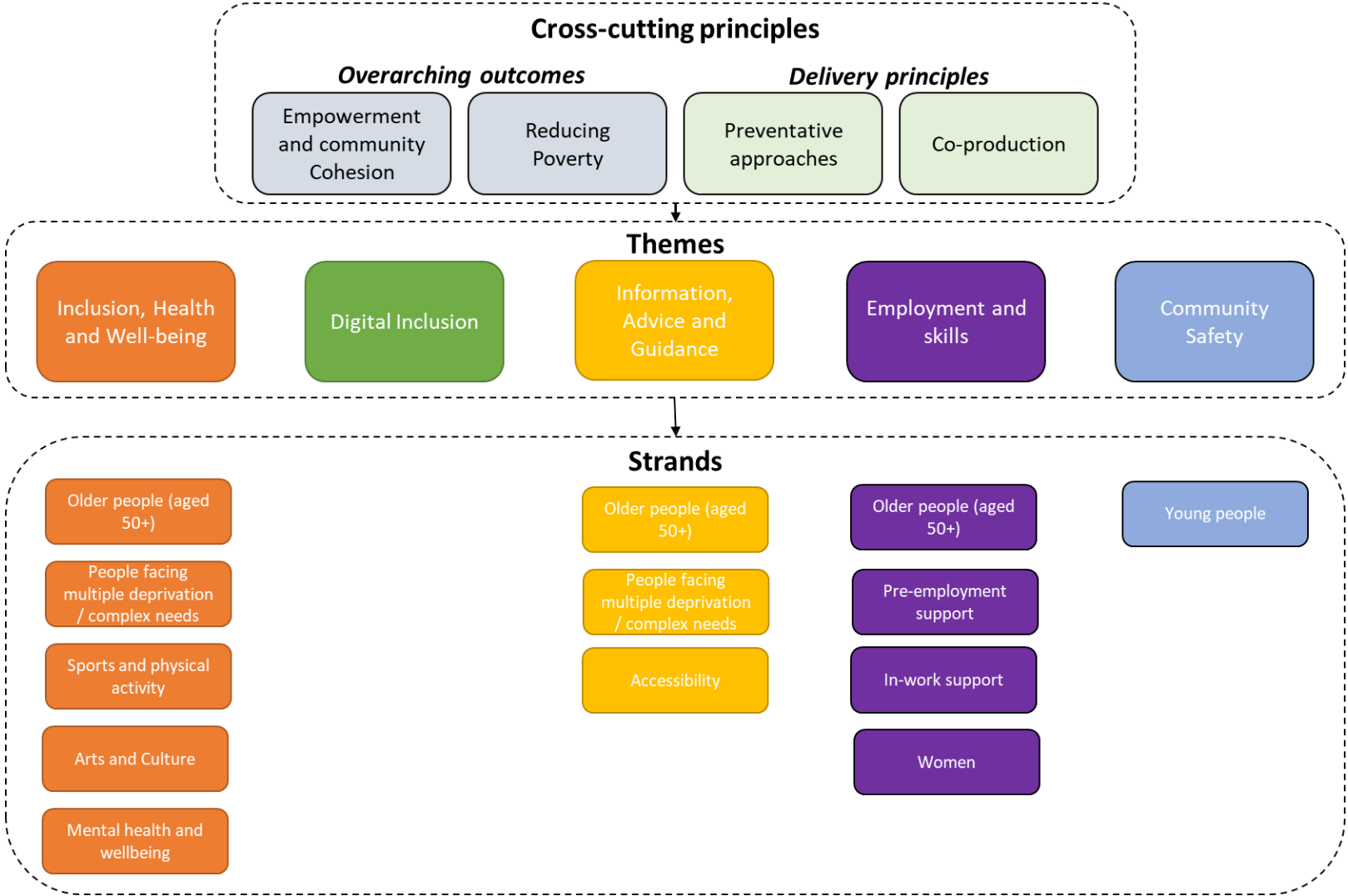
The initial outcome areas were identified during the community workshop events and engagement with the council. These were reviewed as part of the last workshop. Health and wellbeing and Employment and skills were seen to be key priorities.

- Accessibility
- IT and Digital Connectivity
- Employment and skills
- Reduction in Waste
- Community safety, crime and anti-social behaviour

Directorate Priority Areas

- Each of the Directorates (Place; Children's Services; Health, Adults, and Communities (HAC); and Resources) were asked to identify initial ideas for priority areas of focus (within their remit) for the Community Commissioning programme.
- For each area of focus, they provided evidence of need, and identified indicative outcomes.
- Using this information, and the output from the previous workshops, a preliminary structure for Community Commissioning has been developed.

- Themes: broad delivery areas (*themes were identified by grouping together similar areas of focus*)
- Strands: sub-divisions of a theme (*strands were identified by grouping together stakeholder groups, or targeted delivery areas*)

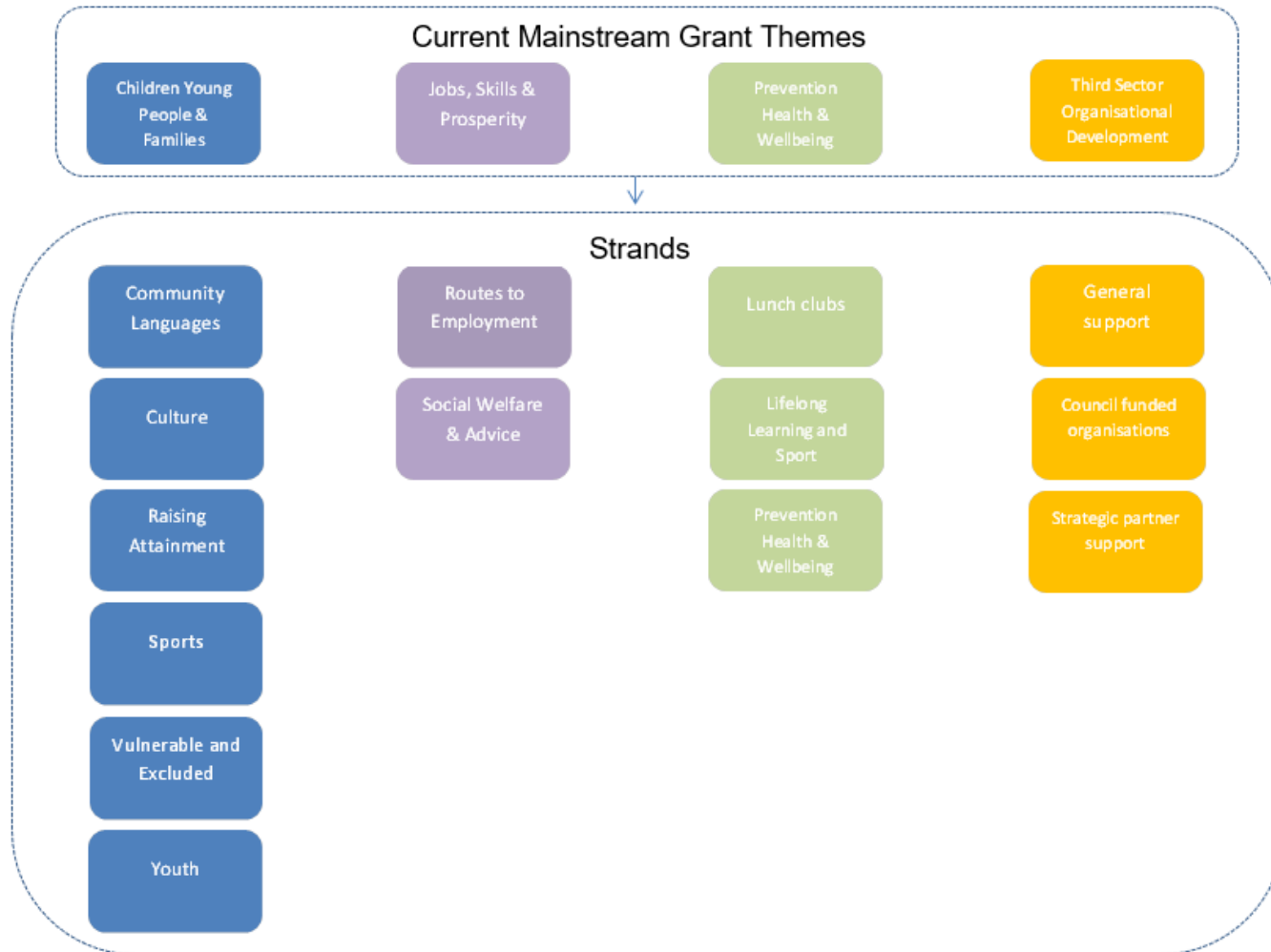
