Are you interested in: design, architecture, geography, psychology, the outdoors and walking, art, local street culture, or simply want to help improve Tower Hamlets?

We would like to collaborate with young women and non-binary people aged 18-30 who live and/or work/study in Tower Hamlets to learn more about how you use and experience green spaces in the borough.

Apply to work with researchers from Queen Mary University of London and Officers from London Borough of Tower Hamlets to make green space welcoming to everyone.

Your time and expertise on the project will be recognised with a payment of £200.

No prior research experience is necessary.

What: The network of green streets, parks and canals in Tower Hamlets is loved by residents and visitors and is a valuable community asset. With your help we would like to learn more about how women and non-binary people use and experience these spaces.

Who: This project is open to women and non-binary people aged 18-30 years who live and/or work/study in Tower Hamlets.

What will community researchers do?

- Participate in two 2-hour workshops at Queen Mary's Mile End campus (9th May and 23rd May, 4.30-6.30pm)
- Complete three walks and record reflections via an app (if possible) and a walking journal between these two workshops
- Participate in EITHER the Festival of Communities (8th June 2024, 11.00am-3.00pm or 12.00pm-4.00pm; Stepney Green Park OR a design workshop (12th June 2024, 10.00am-2.00pm; Tower Hamlets Town Hall).
